Rossmoyne's \$14m Redevelopment Begins

Dr Mike Nahan, the Member for Riverton congratulated Rossmoyne Senior High School on the commencement of its major redevelopment program to improve the school's aging facilities.

"The earthworks have started on the State-funded \$14m capital works program that will provide a substantial extension and enhancement of the school's amenities," said Dr Nahan.

"The works, which will take about a year to complete, include an extension to the Performing Arts Centre, two art studios and a photography studio, an expanded reception area, a special English and Languages block, a new cafeteria and an ampitheatre."

"In addition, some demountable classrooms will be removed and some old buildings will be demolished to make way for the installation of an international-sized soccer pitch."

Dr Nahan said he had lobbied for the funding to be made available to the school and had been very pleased when it had been allocated in the State Budget in 2009.

"Like many local State schools, Rossmoyne Senior High School has been long overdue for a major upgrade," said Dr Nahan.

"The school has a very strong community-based Council that has also been working hard to obtain these new state-of-the-art facilities. Once completed, the new works will significantly enhance the school's campus and provide an improved learning atmosphere for the students."

"The new works, together with the school's new Independent Public School status and strong leadership from Principal Leila Bothams and Chairman Professor Gordon Parkinson, will help Rossmoyne to remain a leading public high school well into the future."
