Rossmoyne High School Plans \$14m Improvements

Dr Mike Nahan, the Member for Riverton welcomed Rossmoyne Senior High School's initial plans to spend its \$14m funding from the State Government, to establish a language centre, a visual arts centre, an amphitheatre and a cafeteria for students on the school grounds.

Local Members of Parliament, Dr Mike Nahan (Riverton) and Hon Christian Porter (Bateman) viewed the initial concept plans when they visited the school last week with School Principal Terry Sanbrook and School P & C President Helene Ostrini.

"The school is very conscious of the need to utilise the funding wisely and to build facilities that meet the needs of Rossmoyne students and the local community now and in the future," said Dr Nahan.

Dr Nahan, who is a keen advocate of upgrading school facilities, said Rossmoyne Senior High School's infrastructure had been showing obvious signs of aging.

"Like many of the local State schools, Rossmoyne Senior High School is long overdue for a major upgrade," said Dr Nahan.

"The planned facilities will enhance the school's campus and provide an improved learning atmosphere for the students."

"I am very pleased to see that the school is considering building a dedicated facility for languages. I would like to see a focus on Mandarin as this will help up and coming Western Australians engage with our major trading partner, China, in the years to come."

Dr Mike Nahan said he and the Minister for Education, Hon Elizabeth Constable, who was instrumental in providing the school with the funds in the State Budget, were pleased that the school was getting on with the planning so quickly.

"The school has been very proactive in its quest to provide excellent facilities and services to its students. I would also encourage the school to open the language facilities to the community," said Dr Nahan.
